## About The Speakers:

### Mr Anthony Rogers, GBS, QC, JP

Mr Rogers was called to the Bar in England and Wales in 1969. As a barrister he specialized in intellectual property and other civil cases. He was appointed Queen's Counsel in 1984. In 1993, he became a Judge of the High Court of Hong Kong. Before his retirement he was a Vice-President of the Court of Appeal. He now practises as an arbitrator (CI Arb) and mediator (CEDR accredited).

### Ms Winnie Tam SC

Ms Tam was called to the Bar in England and Wales in 1988. She has since been practising in the field of intellectual property. In 2006, she was appointed Senior Counsel and is currently practising from Des Voeux Chambers. She is a member of the HKIAC panel of IP arbitrators. In 2015, she was appointed a Recorder of the Court of First Instance. Currently she is the Chairman of the Hong Kong Bar Association
